AS WE GATHER

On this Palm Sunday, the sixth Sunday in Lent, we cry out, "I just need to know somebody prays." We want someone to lift us up, to fight for us, but too often we feel put down and preyed upon, and therefore cynical and defensive. Praise the Lord that when we pray, He promises to rush to our aid. "I call upon the Lord... and I am saved from my enemies" (Psalm 18:3). Jesus not only died for us so God would hear our prayer, but He Himself continually prays for us. Now we can go forth, knowing that we are lifted up, and pray in confidence for the needs of others.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

- P: Friends in Christ, because Jesus prays for us, we can now draw near with a true heart and confess our sins to God our Father, asking Him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to forgive us.
- C: O God, our Father, we admit and confess that we are by nature sinful and unclean and that we have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed.
- P: In our sin, we are our own worst enemy (Psalm 18:3).
- C: In our sin, the cords of death encompass us (Psalm 18:4).

P: In our sin, the torrents of destruction assail us (Psalm 18:4).

C: In our sin, we are in great distress (Psalm 18:6).

P: Friends in Christ, from His temple, God has heard your voice, and your cry to Him has reached His ears. He sent Jesus to die on the cross for you and to rescue you from your enemies of sin, death and the devil. Because of Jesus, God delights in you, and He forgives you all your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

PSALM Psalm 18:1-6, 16-19

(We glorify God, who is always ready to hear our prayers.)

P: I love you, O Lord, my strength.

C: The Lord is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer,

P: My God, my rock, in whom I take refuge,

C: My shield, and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold.

P: I call upon the Lord, who is worthy to be praised,

C: And I am saved from my enemies.

P: The cords of death encompassed me;

C: The torrents of destruction assailed me;

P: The cords of Sheol entangled me;

C: The snares of death confronted me.

P: In my distress I called upon the Lord;

C: To my God I cried for help.

P: From his temple he heard my voice,

C: And my cry to him reached his ears.

P: He sent from on high, he took me;

C: He drew me out of many waters.

P: He rescued me from my strong enemy and from those who hated me,

C: For they were too mighty for me.

P: They confronted me in the day of my calamity,

C: But the Lord was my support.

P: He brought me out into a broad place;

C: He rescued me, because he delighted in me.

P: God of all power and might, whose ear is always attentive to the cries of Your people, give us knees that kneel before You daily in prayer, bringing before Your throne the cares and concerns of all our neighbors, through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Advocate in heaven, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

So Satan went out from the presence of the Lord and struck Job with loathsome sores from the sole of his foot to the crown of his head. And he took a piece of broken pottery with which to scrape himself while he sat in the ashes. Then his wife said to him, "Do you still hold fast your integrity? Curse God and die."

GOSPEL READING: John 17:13-26

(Jesus prays for His disciples -- both those who walked with Him 2,000 years ago and those who still walk with Him today.)

But now I am coming to you, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves. I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. I do not ask that you take them out of the world, but that you keep them from the evil one. They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. And for their sake I consecrate myself, that they also may be sanctified in truth.

"I do not ask for these only, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. The glory that you have given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that you sent me and loved them even as you loved me. Father, I desire that they also, whom you have given me, may be with me where I am, to see my glory that you have given me because you loved me before the foundation of the world. O righteous Father, even though the world does not know you, I know you, and these know that you have sent me. I made known to them your name, and I will continue to make it known, that the love with which you have loved me may be in them, and I in them."
