The Redeemer Serves team exists to celebrate and encourage acts of love and service in the community and toward one another at Redeemer, and we are excited to report that there was no shortage during 2022. In total, Redeemer members and friends served for over 3,000 community service hours, raised over \$18,000 in donations and supplies to benefit local organizations, and impacted more than 25 different organizations or demographics of people.

At the beginning of this year, the serves team set a goal that 12 different groups of people at Redeemer would serve in at least 1 new way this year. Together, we met this goal exactly. 12 different groups of people found at least one NEW way to serve in 2022 that they had never served before. In total, there were over 20 service projects completed that had never been done by that group before. Thanks for stepping out of your comfort zone and finding new ways to love others!

Through the work of 27 different Redeemer groups or teams, together we completed over 50 different service projects that benefited over 25 different groups of people or local charity organizations. On average, that is one service project every single week!

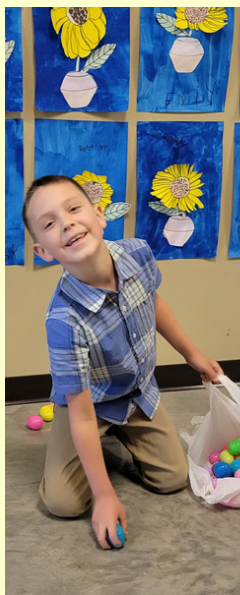
